Holy.

The season of Lent ends this month with Holy Week. What gives this week its name is its dedication to the veneration of the last days of Jesus' life and ministry, and his death on a cross. This week has shaped my understanding of what it means to be holy. I have come to understand that it has less to do with the squeaky clean image of living a perfect life and is more about choosing to live into being faithful to what is good and right amidst the messiness and difficulties and failures of life. After all, if there is anything I've learned from the season of Lent it is that I am certainly not perfect, and that in my attempt to follow Jesus I fail. I sin. I miss the mark, miss the point. But in that is the beauty of Holy Week and in the search for that which is holy in this life. God, who is the Holy of holies, entered into human flesh as Jesus of Nazareth and redeemed all that is unholy about human life, all that is unholy about us. God loves us and forgives us when we fail. God proved this as one of us.

God was born by way of the dangerous, risky, and messy process of childbirth. God was a snotty-nosed kid who scraped his knees and needed his mom to feed him and his dad to teach him how to play. He got tired, slept, cried, hurt, got angry, experienced hunger, and knew what it meant to lose. He lived, breathed, had the breath knocked out of him, bled, and died. Along the way, he revealed God's holiness in human flesh. He loved and laughed, hugged the lonely and healed the sick, had dinner with criminals, blessed children, taught those hungering to learn, washed dirty feet, challenged religious leaders, held church people accountable to their commitment of faith, forgave the unforgiven, and loved the unlovable. Jesus showed us that we don't have to look to or reach for the sky to find the holy, because the holy is here on earth in our daily lives.

Last month I had the privilege to accompany our deacons on their annual retreat. While we were there, we worshiped together, washed one another's feet, served each other communion, laughed and cried, and talked about what it means to serve each other. It was a holy experience. It was holy not because any of us are perfect, but because in our imperfections we came together to share in a common life of love, forgiveness, and service with and to one another. As servant-leaders our deacons and staff have made a commitment to lead holy lives through a life and ministry of service. This does not mean that we will be perfect. We will make mistakes. But we are committed to forgiving one another and showing grace. What it does mean, though, is that we are committed to offering consolation for those that are grieving loss, providing support to someone in the hospital, being a companion to the person who is lonely, showing hospitality to the stranger, and being a friend to our neighbors. Please pray for the leaders of our church as we try to lead by example. We are also praying for you. Ultimately, we are in this together, and will learn from one another what it means to be holy when we follow in the footsteps of Jesus and become a servant of God.


CHILDREN AND YOUTH


